Maine Service Fellows helps rural communities tackle their most critical needs, with a focus on building climate resilience. The program increases the opportunities for recent college graduates to devote a year of service, use their skills to make a difference, and strengthen civic engagement and community resilience through engaging community residents in volunteer-based solutions. Maine Service Fellows recruits individuals within 5 years of their higher education degree, so apply today if you want to make a meaningful difference in a small-town community's fight against climate changel

- Living Allowance of ~\$28,000 per term
- Educational Award for Student Loans of ~\$5,600
- Full Health Care Coverage
- Paid Time Off

About You

You will help the Town of Van Buren advance several critical climate action resiliency projects including implementing the Town's Community Resilience Partnership-funded projects; engage volunteers and build partnerships; and conduct outreach to increase awareness of resources, including engaging vulnerable populations.

Activities include conducting an environmental risk assessment, developing a volunteer recruitment plan, developing educational materials, hosting community workshops on resilience, applying for grants, coordinating flood preparedness projects, developing a town-wide resilience plan, and host public events.

To be a Maine Service Fellow, you must...

- Be at least 20 years of age and hold a college degree (associates, bachelors, or graduate) by the start of their service term in January.
- Be eligible to work in the United States and pass a background check that includes a criminal history record check.
- Live in the community impacted by their project.

Strong applicants will have:

- Knowledge, skills, and experience in the development and implementation of climate resilience projects
- Ability and comfort with working with people.
- Comfort with working independently and ability to be self-directed and take initiative.
- Strong written and verbal communication skills.

Exceptional applicants will have:

Bilingualism in French and English
